

# Sajan is first-ever Indian swimmer to make Olympic cut

New Delhi, June 27: Sajan Prakash on Saturday became the first-ever Indian swimmer to qualify for the Olympic Games by breaching the 'A' standard time, clocking 1:56:38 seconds in the men's 200m butterfly event at the Sette Colli Trophy in Rome, Italy.

The Games 'A' standard was set at 1:56.48 seconds and the 27-year-old Prakash completed the run 0.10 seconds faster at the FINA-accredited Olympic qualifier.

"Historic moment in Indian Swimming !!!

Sajan Prakash breaks the glass ceiling clocks 1:56.38 an Olympic qualification time. CONGRATULATIONS," tweeted Swimming Federation of India.

Sajan also rewrote his own national record of 1:56.96s that he had set last week at the Belgrade Trophy swimming competition.

This will be Sajan's second successive Olympics, having represented India in the 2016 Rio Games.

He will take part in the Tokyo Games alongside Maana Patel, who has been nominated by the

Swimming Federation of India for the Universality places.

Sajan's direct qualification means Srihari Nataraj, who missed the 'A' the 100m men's backstroke by 0.05s in Rome on Friday, will not be competing in the Tokyo Games despite being nominated for the Universality places.

The Universality quota allows one male and one female competitor from a country to participate in the Olympics, provided no other swimmer from the same gender qualifies for the Games or receives a FINA invite based

on his or her Olympic Selection time (B time).

The Kerala swimmer had always been optimistic about breaching the elusive 'A' mark.

"This is not my peak yet, when I peak after some skill sharpening, after that I think it (A mark) will happen. I have to be patient for that," he had told PTI in April after he clocked 1:57.85s in the Uzbekistan Open Championship.

Since then he has constantly improved his time. Last week, in the Belgrade Trophy swimming competition he had clocked 1:56.96 seconds.

It was a good day for Indian swimming as TOPS developmental swimmer Kenisha Gupta also created a national record.

The Mumbai swimmer clocked 57.35 second in the 100m freestyle event at the Rome event.

## Modi govt harassing farmers since 2014: Cong

New Delhi, June 27: The Modi government has been harassing farmers not just for the last seven months of their protest against the three farm laws, but since it came to power seven years ago, the Congress alleged on Saturday.

Party chief spokesperson Randeep Surjewala also posed a set of seven questions to the central government, asking whether it was working on a policy to "tire and drive away, harass and defeat, defame and divide" the protesting farmers by conspiring against them.

The protest against the laws by farmers camping at various Delhi border points began in November last year and they are demanding that the legislations be withdrawn.

"Even though farmers are sitting on an agitation since November last year, the Modi government has been conspiring to harass them for the last seven years ever since it came to power in 2014 by bringing the Land Acquisition Act to take away their land," Surjewala said.

The Government and farmer unions have held 11 rounds of talks so far, the last being on January 22, to break the deadlock and end the protest. Talks have not resumed following widespread violence during a tractor rally by protesting farmers on January 26.

The Supreme Court has put on hold the implementation of the laws till further orders and has set up a committee to find solutions, and it has already submitted its report.

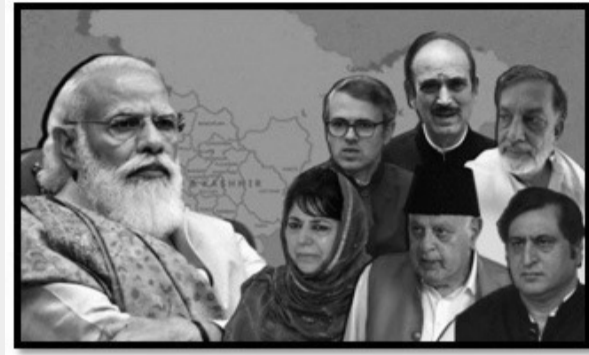

The invited leaders of the alliance included NC Dr. Farooq Abdullah, PDP's Mehbooba Mufti, and CP(M)'s Mohammad Yousuf Tarigami apart from Modi, Amit Shah, National Security Advisor Ajit Doval and Jammu and Kashmir Lt.Governor Manoj Sinha and BJP national president JP Nadda and Home Secretary. The other leaders who participated in the meeting included

Congress Gulam Nabi Azad, Tara Chand, Omar Abdullah, GA Mir, Altaf Bukari, Sajad Gani Lone, Prof. Bheem Singh, Ravinder Raina, Nirmal Singh and Kavinder Gupta.

The pro-people oriented meeting focused on elections in the UT which is underway. The leaders kept 5 demands in the meeting- grant of statehood soon, conduct assembly elections, rehabilitation of Kashmiri Pundits in J&K, political detainees should be released and on domicile rules. All political parties agreed that there should be peace in the valley and a government should come there democratically which is also the agenda of the Centre to restore normalcy in J&K. The meeting also



discussed in detail the implementation of many pro-people initiatives. Modi expressed his satisfaction with the developments in J&K and said the goal was to give fresh hope to the aspirations among the people. Modi appealed that everyone should work in national interest so that people in the valley benefit. He said that safety and security needs to be ensured for all in J&K. He wants to remove the "Dilli ki Duri" and "Dil Ki Duri". The 24th meeting will be historic if elections are conducted and normalcy is restored in J&K with the full cooperation of all the political parties. Then, BJP will restore its stature to Himalayan heights.

## TN's Dhanalakshmi wins 100m; injured Hima may miss Tokyo

Patiala, June 27: Tamil Nadu's S Dhanalakshmi won the 100m dash at the National Inter-State Championships while national record holder Dutee Chand finished fourth on a day when another star sprinter Hima Das did not start after injuring herself in the heat races, putting her in doubt for the Tokyo Olympics.

All the competitors in women's 100m final race returned with mediocre timings even as Dhanalakshmi emerged as the fastest woman of the tournament, clocking 11.52 seconds, ahead of Sri Lanka's Amasha de Silva (11.59) and Archana Suseendran (11.60) of Tamil Nadu.

Dutee, who had clocked

11.17 seconds in the Indian Grand Prix 4 earlier this week at the same NIS tracks to shatter her own national record, finished fourth with a time of 11.62. She was seen having some discomfort while crossing the finishing line.

Dutee though is likely to qualify for the Olympics on the basis of world rankings as she is sitting pretty at 41st spot in the Road to Tokyo list. Fifty-six athletes will compete in the Tokyo Olympics women's 100m race.

Hima, who has had a lower back injury problem for a long time, did not start in the final after sustaining a muscle pull during the 100m heats in the morning session. The extent of her injury

could not be ascertained officially. But it is learnt that the Assam athlete is highly unlikely to run the 200m race scheduled on Sunday as well as the women's 4x100m relay final on June 29.
